

From the Rabbi's desk

As I write this, my daffodils have just started to come up. By the time you receive this issue of The Voice, I believe they will be in full bloom. Yes, spring is in the air. Rebirth is here, or should I say, BIRTH! I am now the proud *savta* (grandmother) of Ori Noam, born last month to proud parents Amy Edelstein and Michael Gross. It was a joy to have his *brit milah* right here at Temple Beth Sholom. We thank all of you for your well wishes and blessings.

When spring arrives and with it new life and new beginnings, Passover cannot be far behind. Passover is known by many names-Pesach/Passover; Zeman Heiruteinu/ the season of our liberation; Hag HaMazot/the festival of Matzah; and finally Hag ha-Aviv/the holiday of spring. We know that Passover celebrates our liberation from bondage while we were in Egypt, and that is why Passover is also known as "zeman heirutinu." We are forbidden to eat anything leaven and are commanded to eat matzah-hence the name "Hag Ha-matzot." The Jewish calendar is also set so that Passover must take place in the spring, and that is why we call Passover Hag Ha-Aviv. But is the connection between our celebrating freedom and spring intentional or coincidental?

I say it is intentional. The Israelites, who were enslaved by Pharaoh, and seemed destined for degradation and perhaps annihilation, break forth out of Egypt into a new life towards the land of milk and honey, just like new growth bursts forth from the hard, cold ground into the warmth of spring.

Rabbi Michael Strassfeld writes in *The Jewish Holidays*, "The watchwords of both spring and Pesah are *rebirth* and *hope*. Thus, the spirit of renewed optimism aroused by the sights and smells of spring are reinforced in a Jewish context by Passover with its trumpeting of the possibilities of liberation. Passover reminds us annually that no matter how terrible our situation, we must not lose hope."

I also see rebirth and much optimism here at Temple Beth Sholom. We had a wonderful, joyfilled Shabbat Across America celebration. On Purim eve, our sanctuary was filled with much merry-making, mirth and laughter as we read the *Megillah* and booed the evil Haman. We have also welcomed many new members into our congregation.

Walt and I wish you a joyous and *zissen* Pesach!



After a visit to an urgent care facility on Sunday, some Jewish penicillin (chicken soup), Mucinex, antibiotic eye drops and lots of liquids, I'm slowly improving.

While I was feeling generally lousy, I felt equally badly about not being at services, whether at the nursing home, or at Temple. It's not just that I felt like I was letting folks down. I really missed being there, sharing and engaging. I felt let down.

I guess what I'm saying is "thank you" to the communities I serve. I get as much or more from doing this than you do.

In some roundabout way, I began heading down this cantorial road some 35 years ago as cantor for High Holiday Services at a Reform synagogue in Old Bethpage. I've done all sorts of services in all sorts of places over the ensuing years. And with all that, I still enjoy the opportunities to engage with a congregation every week. It truly is a privilege.

I don't want to be overly dramatic. I'm going to be just fine-it's just a bad cold with some annoying side effects. But this gave me pause, and the opportunity to reflect on how fortunate I am to get to do what I do. Thanks for being such a supportive and wonderful Temple Community and Family. See you at services. Time to get back to singing!



Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, March 11, 2024, via Zoom. Presient Joy Bobrow thanked Dr. Fay Schildkraut and the Membership Committee for again taking responsibility for the recent wonderful Shabbat Across America. She thanked Beth Dulberg and Elana White for the Bazaar basket campaign. She reviewed required procedures to assure that all accounting is maintained within the various Arms of the Temple and that meetings are scheduled without overlap.

The Board unanimously voted Beth Dulberg as Trustee for the vacancy created when Joe deLeon was elected as an Officer. Gail Tishcoff, Recording Secretary, presented the February minutes, which were accepted. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we currently have 110 member units as we added one family unit last month. There was no Financial Report this month.

Rabbi Ballan reported on the birth of her grandson, Ori Noam Edelstein, and the bris the next morning at Temple. Her daughter, Amy, is doing well and the baby is "wonderful and beautiful." Shabbat Across America was a wonderful, well-attended evening, and Fay and the Membership Committee outdid themselves. Purim preparations are underway, and volunteer Megillah readers to chant or read in English are still needed. 



Ingredients:

Ingredients For Cake

4 Eggs
1 Cube White Sugar
4 oz. Almond paste, broken into pieces or processed in food processor for 30 seconds
2 sticks (1 cup) unsalted butter or margarine
½ cup Matzah cake meal
½ tsp salt
½ tsp salt
½ tsp kosher for Passover Vanilla Extract Red and Green food coloring (about 8 drops each)

For Chocolate Glaze

1 cup dark or semisweet chocolate chips 1 Tbsp. vegetable shortening or oil Pinch salt

Raspberry Jam

Special equipment: three square baking pans, offset spatula, food scale. Total Time: 30 minutes + chilling time **Yield:**18-24 cookies

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350F. Grease your pans. Add parchment paper to bottom of each pan. Grease again and add light dusting of matzah cake meal. Tap pan to remove any excess flour.
- Using a hand mixer (or whisk attachment to stand mixer), mix eggs and sugar until thick and yellow. Add crumbled almond paste and combine.
- Add melted butter (or margarine), matzah cake meal, almond flour, salt, and vanilla.
- Divide batter into three even amounts. (Try using a food scale if eyeballing is too difficult.) Leave one plain. Add green food coloring to one batch of batter. Add red food coloring to the other batch of batter.
- Pour batter into prepared pans. Bake for 10-12 minutes, or until just set and no longer wet in the middle.
- Allow to cool completely.
- Place chocolate, shortening, and pinch of salt in a glass bowl. Microwave for 30 second intervals until melted. Stir vigorously to ensure there are no clumps.
- Place a piece of parchment paper on top of a platter or baking sheet. Add red cake layer to parchment paper. Spread thin layer of raspberry jam. Top with white layer. Add another thin layer of raspberry jam. Top with green cake.
- Carefully spread half the melted chocolate on top. Place in refrigerator for 15-20 minutes or until completely hard.
- Turn over and spread remaining chocolate on other side. Place back in refrigerator for 30 minutes or overnight.
- Trim edges and slice into cookies.

Adult Education




