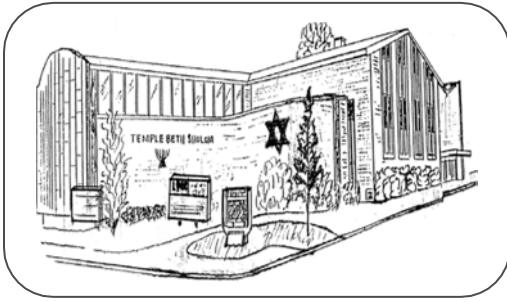

## From the Rabbi's desk

Shalom,

### Welcoming September: A Season of Return

As summer draws to a close and we return from vacations, rest, and renewal, we find ourselves entering the sacred season of reflection. September ushers in the High Holidays—a time of gathering, introspection, and spiritual realignment. Whether you spent your summer near or far, welcome back to Temple Beth Shalom.

Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur invite us into the heart of *teshuvah*—a Hebrew word often translated as “repentance,” but its roots are from the Hebrew word for “return.” Not only do we return to community and synagogue, but we are also called to return to our best selves, to our core values, to one another, and to God.

*Teshuvah* is not about guilt or shame; it’s about growth and hope. The gates of compassion are always open, and during these Days of Awe, we are reminded that transformation is always possible. With honest reflection, heartfelt prayer, and the support of community, we each have the power to repair relationships, to heal, and to begin again.

Most of us use this time to focus on forgiveness. We ask forgiveness for the wrongdoings we have committed, but it is also important to forgive the wrongs that have been done to us. We learn in Ben Sira [28:2-4]: “*Forgive your neighbors for their wrongdoings, and then your sins will be forgiven when you pray. Should one person cherish anger against another, and then ask for healing from God? Does that person have no mercy for a person like themselves, and yet pray for personal sins?*”

May 5786 be a year of sweetness, strength, and peace. May your journey of *teshuvah* lead you to deeper connection and purpose. And may we all be inscribed and sealed for a good year.

As we enter the High Holidays, now more than ever, I am grateful that we have Temple Beth Sholom. We do not have to go seeking or wonder where we will worship for the holidays. We have a home!! This is something that we can never take for granted. We are one of the lucky few. Let's keep TBS alive, not only for us, but for our future generations.

I, and my family, have much to be thankful for, as I believe we all do!

## July & August Board of Trustees Meetings

The Board of Trustees met on July 14, and August 11, 2025. The June and the July meeting minutes were approved. Beth Dulberg was thanked for updating, cleaning, and painting the front lawn signage. All event organizers must remember to send Natalie proofread flyers and Voice articles.

President Bobrow thanked all who participated in summer services and gave a shout-out to Religious School students Matthew Cohen and Walter Lothammer, who did a wonderful job leading the August 8 service. Physical tickets will not be issued again this year for High Holidays. Consider donating toward the many special events this year, such as the Open House, to defray the cost. We will be able to proceed with security enhancements via the New York State Security Grant and hope to have a contract signed within the next few weeks.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported as of July 31, 2025 our member unit number is now 107 due to the passing of Betty Zimmermann. Statements will be mailed at the end of August to any member with an outstanding balance and who is not on a payment plan. Treasurer Charlene Metz reviewed the June and the July Financial Reports which were approved by the Board as presented.

Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported summer services have been going wonderfully. Healing Service will return August 19, and she encouraged all to join this meaningful opportunity to pray and meditate together. In the coming weeks, she and Cantor Korobow will be busy preparing for the High Holy Days. Confirmation Class will be leading the Children's Services. Torah Study will resume in September with lively discussions and a meditative Shabbat Service. On Tuesday evenings, starting September 9, the Beginning Hebrew Class will resume following the Healing Service.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit & Ritual Committee Chair, reported Shabbat Service birthday blessings will be done at the first service of each month, except for September, when it will be at the Open House. There are several 6:00 pm services planned for during the year; some with dinner following the service, others with an enhanced Oneg. High Holy Day Evening Services will begin at 7:30 pm this year. She thanked those who already made their participation requests and asked others to not wait to be asked; call or email her with preferences. We need ushers. The Mi Shebayrach list will be starting fresh with the September 26 Shabbat Service. Candle lighting and Kiddush honors for Shabbat Services are always needed.

### Bernstein Bowling Blog

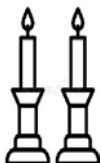

And, as I found out, when I met Betty---and we shared history and stories; when the annual overnight camping season concluded in August; for many years, that is where Betty went as part of a religious retreat.

And, while all the preceding instances in the game of Jewish Geography are amazing, one other fact connects Renee and me to Betty for all eternity. When we got married in May of 2014, we did so offsite at Long Island's beautiful Sea Cliff Manor in a very special ceremony presided over by Rabbi Ballan. However, where the festivities were held outside, and the venue didn't have its own covering, Betty asked us if we would like to use one of her chupahs; to which we responded that we would be both extremely honored and thrilled to do so.

So, as we stood under it together, and looked out at the water below, with the sun shining down on us, we knew that even though she was not physically there, that she was there in our lives, sharing this most treasured day with us. And, as we look through our photo album, glance at our proofs and watch the video, we know that Betty will always be there.

This game of "Jewish Geography" is something very special that as a decade's old television commercial would have said, "it's a game the whole family can play." So, don't miss out on it---you'll never know what hidden treasures you will find.
